Plymouth Salem certainly went toe-to-toe with some of the state's heavyweights in girls basketball this season.

The Rocks suffered two closs setbacks in the season-ending Western Lakes Activities Association playoffs, but regrouped in the state tournament to win the tough Northville district before being ousted in the regional final by Birmingham Marian.

For his efforts, coach Fred Thomann has been selected Observer-land Coach of the Year. The former Michigan State captain has guided the Lady Rocks to an impressive 247-77 record in 13 seasons, including three Final Four berths and two final eight spots.

"We played in some great games this year and we made an ince tourney run," Thomann said. "The other thing that was gratifying was watching the growth of our underclassmen. It was nice to see how they developed and

stepped up to the next level of competition."

The future appears bright for the Rocks, who return three start-ers for 1996.
