Central Michigan for two years to get his sports certifica-tion, which allowed him to be an athletic trainer. After that, he carned his master's in physical education and sports medicine from Ohio University.

Robinson then got involved with a service that provides ath-lette trainers for high schools. His last job, in Farmington, was through the Bustsord Centre's To-tal Rehabilitation and Condition-ing Center (TRACC). In the past, he helped supply athletic trainers

for the Gardon City and Plymouth-Canton systems.
His hiring gives the school district something unique: Two former athletic trainers reving as sports coordinators. Heinman was Canton's athletic trainer (PC no longer contracts out for trainers; rather, it employs them itself) prior to taking over as at letic coordinator at Canton.
"That's an interesting thing, but I think it's a natural progression," said Robinson. "As an athletic trainer, you get to know all the coaches and work with them,


