Falcons earn 3 silver medals at Berkley

Farmington High had three individual runners-up Saturday while finishing sixth among 16 wrestling teams in the Berkley Invitational.

Matt Michalski (112), Mike Lane (125) and Charlie Jaeger (130) placed second at their weights, and teammate Sevan Sahiner (103) tied with North Farmington's Scott Richmond for third.

Michalski suffered his first loss in the finals, losing a 7-2 decision to defending state champ Darnell Ruffin of Flint Northern.

"It was closer than that," Farmington coach Al Beyer said. "The last four points were out of frustration."

"Matt was disappointed but he bounces back quick. He'll work hard to correct his mistakes and go from there."

"Overall, I was real happy with the team performance," Beyer said. "Everyone had one of their better days there."
