

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**FIRE RUNS**  
Farmington Hills firefighters made 37 runs for the week of Jan. 22-28 including 46 (46 percent) medical emergencies, eight rescue calls, nine service calls and eight fires.

**FIRE**  
Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 responded to a fire in the laundry room of the Franklin Hills Country Club on Inkater at 3:10 p.m. Jan. 26. The fire, which caused \$100 in property damage and \$500 in damage to contents, had been extinguished. Towels in a laundry basket had been smoldering and a smoke detector had alerted employees to the fire, which they put out with an extinguisher.

**FIRE**  
Firefighters from Stations 2 and 3 responded to a fire behind East Middle School on Middlebelt at 11:09 p.m. Jan. 26. A can of Gumout wrapped in newspaper had been burning next to bleachers, but had self-extinguished and caused no damage.

**Gun charges filed against Hills man**

Farmington Hills police have issued a warrant for the arrest of a Hills man, 52, for carrying a concealed weapon and reckless discharge of a firearm.

The charge stems from a Jan. 2 incident in which the man's Derringer pistol discharged accidentally while he was at Kinko's on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills.

The man was making copies at about 6:30 p.m. when his beeper went off, police said. He went to a nearby phone when the two-shot pistol fell from his waistband, striking the floor and firing a bullet that grazed his left leg but did not injure anyone else.

The man was taken to Botsford General Hospital where he was treated and released. He told police he had a concealed weapons permit. Police said Wayne County issued the man a concealed weapon permit that allowed him to carry a concealed weapon only when

on duty as a Royal Oak Township reserve officer.

Police have received conflicting reports as to whether he has ever worked for the township. But at the time of the accident, he was not in uniform, or on duty.

The man faces up to five years in prison if convicted on felony charges of carrying a concealed weapon and up to 90 days in jail if convicted of the misdemeanor charge of reckless discharge of a firearm.
