## Jury questioning raises debate

A court showdown on assisted suicide is expected to begin in Circuit Court Monday before Judge Jessica B. Cooper, despite a Michigan Court of Appeals ruing Friday that could affect jury selection for the trial of Dr. Jack Keorckian

ing Friday that could affect jury selection for the trial of D. Jack Kevorkian. That was how attorney Gaoffrey N. Figger reacted on Saturday to the appeals court planned review of whether lawyers should be allowed to probe for what Figger called jurors' "blasses or prejudices" during the selection process. Figgr said those biases could include assisted suicide. Jury selection in the trial of the retired pathologist was acheduled to begin today. However, the Oakland County prosecutor's office on Friday challenged the line of questioning of potential jurors planned by Fieger in the Michigan Court of Appeals.

Prosecutor Richard Thompson claimed Fieger was invading the privacy of prospective jurors by asking specific questions about

religious preferences.

He said it would have a "chill-ing and detrimental" effect to ask jurors their specific religious views or their opinions on assist-

views or their opinions on asset-daulcide.
Fleger said his questions were designed to screen out the people who might have religious feelings that would prejudice them against his client — people the outspoken storney has frequent-ly referred to as "religious nuts." The prosecution "wants to stack the jury against a fair trial," said Fleger, referring to religious fundamentalists as preferred jurors.

Thompson, however, insisted it was the defense that was out of line.

"The questionnaire is more like a Gallup poil than a list to be asked of prospective jurors," said Thompson, Fieger "could get the same information with a routine question, namely: 'is there anything that would prohibit you from following the instructions of the court on assisted suicide?"

Fieger "doesn't have to sak if they consider themselves to be Born Again Christians or whether ur not they tithe to their church," said Thompson, referring to prospective jurors. "People will feel intimidated."

with the Detroit office of the Court of Appeals asking for emergency consideration and a stay of judicial proceedings until the issue is resolved.

Kevorkian is facing two four-year felony charges for the 1993 deaths of Merian Frederick, 72, of Ann Arbor, and Dr. All Khellil, 61, of suburban Chicago. Frederick died Oct. 22 and Khallil died Nov. 22, both in the apartment of Kevorkian, who at that time lived in Royal Gale. The retired physician has since moved to West


