

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**BREAK-INS** The bay door was broken causing \$500 in damage at Sun Environmental on Research April 16-18, and computers, printers, copiers and other equipment worth \$10,000 were stolen.

The passenger window of a 1994 Chrysler LH5 parked at Buddy's Pizzeria on Northwestern Highway was smashed April 16 and a \$500 AM/FM CD stereo was stolen.

The glass front door was broken (\$400) at 12 Milo Cleaners on 12 Milo April 17-18, the cash register and counter were damaged (\$200) and \$200 in coins were stolen.

A child block was thrown through a window (\$300) at the Marathon gas station on Nine Mile April 19 and a cash drawer with \$200 was stolen.

An alarm sounded after window was broken at Delta Gas on Grand River around 10:30 p.m. April 17. Farmington police arrived to find blood splatterings at the scene. Twenty minutes later, an armed robbery was reported at a Citgo service station nearby. Hills police arrested the suspects at Orchard Lake and 12 Mile.

Five charged in gas station hit

Some good police work paid off as Farmington Hills police arrested five people in connection with the April 17 robbery of the Shell gas station at 39200 Grand River near Haggerty in Farmington Hills.

Two citizens witnessed a break-in at the Citgo gas station at Orchard Lake and Grand River in Farmington earlier in the evening and reported the incident, along with a description of a van and its license plate number to Farmington police.

Charged in the robbery were Allen Lynell Cain, 26, and a former

employee at the Shell station, Tequilla Ridden Davis, 21, Corey Antoine Maxwell, 20, Odell Allen Johnson, 20, and Clarence Eugene Jenkins, 19. All five are from Detroit. There was an outstanding warrant for Cain on an embezzlement charge from the Shell station and another embezzlement charge.

Not guilty pleas were entered for the defendants Friday afternoon in 47th District Court at their arraignment before Judge Marla Parker. Bond was set at \$50,000 cash surety for each. Cain had an additional bond of \$20,000 on the two embezzlement charges. Their exam is set for April 29 at 8:30 a.m. in 47th District Court.
