By Anne Fracassa Avanti NewsFeatures Here's a no-nonsense truck that's perfect for a single guy or gal, a couple with small children or a contractor.

This may sound trite, but It's got something for everybody.

The Mazda B4000 4x4 Cab Plus pickup is so versatile it can han-dle towing, taking the family to dinner or hauling a kitchen dinette set across town. It's high off the ground for anyone who loves four-wheeling in a field full of mud and muck. Best of all, it's a comfortable

pickup. My two little girls loved to pickup, My two little girs love to sit in the rear jump seats. My 4-year-old told me the seats were perfect for her. She and her sister could easily see out of the truck and the belts fit around them perfeetly. I even stuck the booster car seat in there for my 3-year-old (very awkward) and it fit decent-

Up front there's a split bench seat, which makes getting a pas-senger into the back very easy. The bench seat can also accommo date three adults, and there are

each. That means you can seat

five without a lot of problems. This year, a driver's-side airbag is standard on all B-Series trucks and a passenger-side airbag is available on SE and LE models. Also standard this year are anti-

Assembled in Edison, N.J., alongside the Ford Ranger pick-up, Mazda's B-Series trucks are offered in three trim levels, with two cab configurations, two bed

Hey, that's a lot to choose from, and prices start at just \$9,925.

There are engine choices as well. The B2300 has a 112-horsepower 2.3-liter 4-cylinder engine, while the B3000 is powered by a 145-horsepower 3.0-liter V6.

I tested the B4000 4-wheel drive Cab Plus SE model. This baby has one of the largest and most powerful powerplants in its class — a 160-horsepower 4.0-liter V6. That translates into fun fourwheeling and easy towing of any-thing under 5,900 pounds.

The suspension is outfitted with an independent twin traction beam with stabilizer bar, and the ride is smooth for a pickup. You're not going to get a luxury-type ride, but it doesn't knock you around the cab like a lot of other manufacturers' trucks.

Sporty body-side graphics add some color and give the truck a special look.

Take a look: Full gauge group (including a tachometer), headilghts-on warning chime, 4-wheel anti-lock brakes, 2-speed trausfer case with shift-on-the-fly, power case with shift-on-the-ily, power assisted steering, power assisted brakes, 72-amp heavy-duty battery, heavy-duty shock absorbers, underbody skid plates, front and rear mud guards, all-terrain 15inch tires, a high-mount stop light, cargo box light, engine com-partment light, map light, inter-mittent windshield wipers, dual mirrors, an AM/FM cassette stereo, tinted glass and fold-down center armrest with storage. The B4000 tested had a lot

more equipment on it, like air conditioning, a premium cassette sterco, sliding rear window, key-less entry, towing package, antitheft system, privacy glass, power window/locks/mirrors and cruise control. With all that equipment, it pumped up the price to just a hair under \$25,000.

For that price, you won't expect this pickup to be easily dismissed by people on the street. It isn't. One woman driving a latemodel pickup rolled down her

window to get information about window to get information about my test truck after chasing after me for four traffic lights. And a stockboy at an office supply store who lugged a 5-foot-long table into the flathed for me said "that's so COOOOL" when he first laid eyes on the truck.

Performance the B4000's got. You wouldn't expect it to be so, but the 4-speed automatic transmission performed well. It's not even sluggish when traversing steep inclines.

All in all, this is a nickup that measures up 100 percent to give you good value, versatility, dura-bility and comfort. Can you really ask for anything more?
