Special coaches have already been selected to serve as coaches. For the girls, the coaches will be Cathy Cole-Kansman, who coached at Farmington HS, and Gene Fogel, one-time Farmington Hills Mercy coach.

The boys team will be coached by Pete Scerri, formerly of Livonia Stevenson, and Ken Johnson, who retired last year after guiding Plymouth Salem to the boys championship.

Now the rosters are set, too. "We're real satisfied with the rosters," said Gary Balconi, former athletic official at Plymouth Salem who has served as a key organizer of the event. "We're looking forward to a great day of soccer."

(23.1) and ranking in the area's top 10 in the long jump.

"Paul was our most effective athlete in so many areas," Lee said of the area's all-state pick. "Paul would do anything for us if it would help the team, and he came through for us this year in a big way. He's a true competitor and leader; he sets examples for the team and makes my job easier."

RUNNING EVENTS

Jason Granger, 200 dash, Harrison: Granger was the Observerland and West Bloomfield champion in the 100 and was co-leader in the area at 10.8 seconds. The senior was one of Observerland's top long jumpers with a best effort of 22.1.

As a junior, he was second in the state for 100 meters. He was injured this year in the regional, which caused him to miss the Western Lakes and Oakland County meets, and he re-injured himself during the Class A final.

"A hamstring injury kept Jason from performing up to his true potential this year," coach John Reed said. "He had an outstanding four years. He is one of the greatest athletes to ever compete in track and field in Observerland history."

Richard Buford, 200 dash, Wayne: Buford had the best area time at 22.7 but also excelled in the 100 and hurdles. In several dual meets, he won both sprint and hurdle races. As for best times, he was the co-leader in the 100 and tops in the high hurdles at 14.9. He was the Mega Conference champ in the 110 hurdles and had a best time of 41 flat in the 300 hurdles.

Richard is a versatile athlete and a hard worker," coach Floyd Carter said. "He competed in any event that would help the team. Richard is going to play college football, and I know he will be successful."

Richard Johnson, 400 dash, Wayne: Johnson qualified for state with an area best time of 49.2. The senior also competed in the long jump and sprint relays.

"Richard is a hard worker who finished every workout strong," Carter said. "He was a leader for the younger runners because of his work ethic. Richard is going to play college basketball, and I know he will be successful."

Scott Pegg, 800 run, Salem: Peggally is the Western Lakes champion, finished second in the regional and was a state qualifier. The senior was a integral part of an outstanding group of mid-distance runners who made Salem a force for several years. His fastest time of 1:58.7 was the best in the area.

"Scott is a hard worker and had a great year for us at Salem," coach Geoff Baker said.

Steve Warner, 1,600 run, Stevenson: Warner finished second at the regional and was a state qualifier with a 4:23.9 time. The best 1,600 run of the season in Observerland. In the 3,200 run, the senior won the West Bloomfield Invitational and was second in the WLAA.

"Steve was also a member of our school record-breaking 3,200 relay team," coach John Gores said. "Steve has been an outstanding athlete for the past four years and has been our most valuable athlete the last two years."

Jared Binecki, 3,200 run, Salem: Binecki capped a fine, four-year career this season and was another of Salem's outstanding distance runners. He was second in the conference and fourth in

the regional in the 3,200. He has the area's best time at 9:42 and was second in the 1,600 at 4:24.2.

"Jared was part of the 3,200 and 1,600 relays, as well as conference champ in the 1,600 run," Baker said. "He was a great asset to the Salem track team."

Ryan Kearney, 110 hurdles, Churchill: Just a freshman, Kearney set school ninth grade marks in the high hurdles (15.0), 200 (13.7) and 400 (52.5).

He was the WLAA champion in the 110 hurdles and took second place in the regional high jump season best 6'0".

"Ryan is an excellent student (3.5 grade point) and plays football and basketball," Churchill coach Rick Austin said. "He's our best all-around athlete, but you forget he's a freshman."

"He has an incredible work ethic and works as hard at practice as he does in a meet. He has a great competitive attitude when he is challenged in any event."

Dan Johnson, 300 hurdles, Salem: The senior set a school record in the 300 intermediate hurdles with an area best time of 40.3.

Among his accomplishments this season: state qualifier, second in the WLAA meet, third at the regional and ninth at the Mansfield (Ohio) Relays. Johnson also competed in the sprint relays.

"Dan worked hard all year to get to this point," Salem coach Geoff Baker said. "He also helped all the other hurdlers become better."

RELAY TEAMS

400, Farmington Harrison (Keith Battle, Chris Knox, Jerrard Johnson and Jason Shappe): The Hawks were first at the Observerland Relays, second in the regional and ninth in the state. Harrison ran an area best of 43.9 in the Class A final. Everyone on the relay will return next season.

"They did a great job, finishing ninth at the state meet," coach John Reed said. "It was a great performance while under a lot of pressure."

800, Farmington Harrison (Keith Battle, Chris Knox, Jerrard Johnson and Jason Granger): The Hawks were Observerland and regional champions and placed ninth in the state meet. Harrison had the area's fastest time at 1:30.2. Granger is the only senior in the group.

"They ran the (best) time at regional and could have run faster if Jason was healthy," Reed said. "It was a tremendous team effort."

1,600, Plymouth Salem (Jason Baryfaki, Jared Binecki, Scott Lowe and Scott Kingsley): The Rocks won the Western Lakes, Observerland and Man Gen Meet championships. Salem was a regional runner-up and state qualifier. The Rocks ran an area best time of 3:27.5.

3,200, Lutheran Westland (Jason Collins, Sam Patterson, Phil Kimmel and Brad Polkinghorne): The Warriors won the Class C championship with a state meet and area best time of 7:59.45. They also won the regional with an 8:18 finish. All four runners are seniors.

"All four team members ran their fastest relay times in the state meet, which was a credit to their determination to be a state champion relay team," Lutheran Westland coach Mike Unger said.

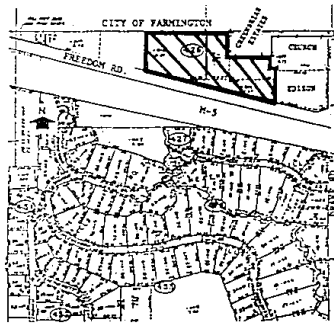

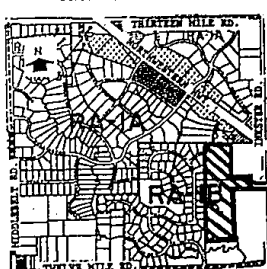

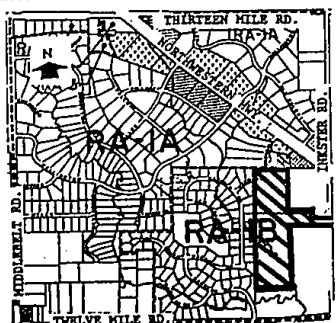
