In an effort to learn more tabout the perch population in Lake St. Clair, Michigan DNR fisheries biologista recently initiated a long-term study on Lake St. Clair perch, the first such study in 13 years.

Biologista hope to tag 2,000 perch and are asking anglers to mastel in the study by reporting information to the DNR on any tagged perch they catch.

"We have several goals for this study, the most important of which is to determine the survival rate of perch in Lake St. Clair," said DNR fisheries
