The landscape surrounding a contemporary home features a hillside rock garden that rests among the beautiful perennial and rose gardens. A small grotto allows one to enjoy unusual specimen shrubs while the sound of a brook surrounding the grounds plays its melody. This large garden will surprise

with its multi-tiered acreage.

The gardens of a Centennial Farmhouse are sure to please as visitors view the 100-foot hedge of Simplicity Roses, and walk through a rose-covered arbor past a charming gazebo. A small, intimate pond will invite you to pause and rest. Colorful perennials, herbs and shrub gardens are designed in keeping with the rural-like ambiance.

If Hostas are to your liking, you won't want to miss the quiet beauty of another of these gardens. Containers filled with annuals add a colorful note on and around the multi-level deck and patio area.

Still another landscape contains a variety of gardens. Bog, vegetable, perennial and rose gardens surround the home and small greenhouse. It is evident that the love of gardening is high on these homeowners' list.

Hybrid experimentation is being done on various types of plants. Blooming potted plants are often placed in various areas of the gardens to enhance the whole. Here you may see the five-foottall Moon flowers, and many forms of Asiatic Lily.
