It is part of a movement by GM to get their employees more involved in community activities.

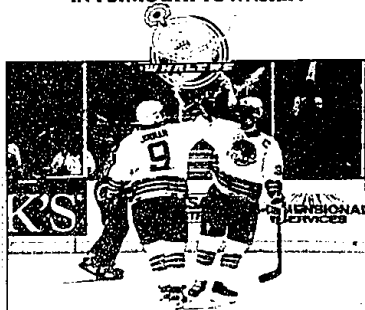
It turned out to be a bonanza for the boys and girls club as they were handed a check for \$7,000 at Thunderbird Lanes.

COUNCIL TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- Received presentation by the Arts Commission.
