

ICE ARENA SCHEDULE

Beginning June 29, the Farmington Hills Ice Arena will offer a family summer ice skating special.

During Saturday and Sunday open skate sessions, one child, age 17 or under, can skate free

in the company of a paying parent. Open skating sessions are Saturday 12:30-2 p.m. and 7-9 p.m., and Sunday from 3:30-5:30 p.m.

Adult admission is \$2.50 per session for residents and \$3.50 per session for non-residents. Effective July 1, admission will be \$3 for resident and \$5 for non-residents.

Open rollerblading and drop-in roller hockey for youths and adults at the arena are from June 25 to July 11.

The Monday-Friday rollerblading sessions are scheduled from 4-6 p.m.
