Her fiancé is a graduate of DeWitt High School. He is a radio announcer, assistant program director and music director at WJG FM in Saginaw.

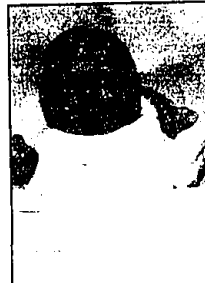
A September wedding is planned at First United Methodist Church in Birmingham.

Her fiancé is a graduate of the University of Michigan. He is currently earning his Ph.D. at Northwestern University.

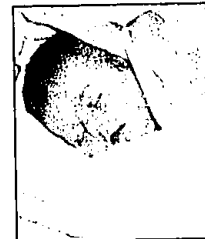

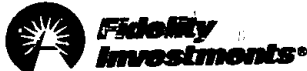
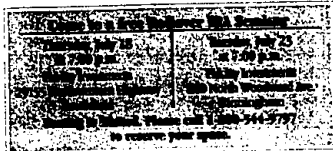
