"I was concerned coming into this game, because (Cadillac Cafe) had incentive, playing the tournament for (late teammate) Greg Grimes. We knew they would be motivated to give us a good game, and they certainly did."

The Fury, a premier team in Little Caesars Division III, won its last three games in the Wolverine after tying the Dearborn Heights Pirates 1-1 in the opener July 6.

Mukhtar took a cross from Street to give Farmington a 1-0 lead in the first game following a scoreless first half.

The Pirates had only two shots on goal, but one was all they needed. On an east-west field in the late evening sun, the Fury players lost sight of an airborne ball long enough for the Pirates to capitalize.

Despite that goal, defenders Young, Meteyer, Guzowski, Kelley and Kruse played a big role in holding down the Dearborn Heights attack, according to coach Meteyer.

"We hadn't faced a situation where we lost or tied the first game," he said, adding the Fury was challenged to come back and win the rest of its games.

Farmington rebounded with a 7-0 victory over the Windsor Cabots Vipers on Saturday.

Kambouris and Street scored two goals apiece; Price, Guzowski and Phillips accounted for one each. Janveja and Mukhtar

assisted on two scoring plays each, Lechowicz, Mooney and Carroll one.

The Fury won its pool-play title July 6 with a 6-1 defeat of Jerry Dean from Sault Ste. Marie (Ontario), which failed to stop Farmington despite employing a good offside trap.

"We put our fastest men on the side, and that was their weakness," Meteyer said.

Lechowicz converted a penalty kick for the first goal. Jerry Dean tied the score, but Janveja made it 2-1 at halftime. Janveja scored two more in the second half and Mukhtar, who also had two assists, one.

The Fury faced Jerry Dean again in the final July 7 and again won 5-1. The Canadian team tried to double team Janveja early in the game and got an emotional life early when Janveja was stopped on a penalty kick.

"We beat Dean the first day because of strong midfield play," Meteyer said. "This time we relied on our defense. Every time they entered our half of the field, the defense stopped the ball."

The Fury broke a 1-1 halftime tie with second-half goals by Phillips, Mukhtar, Street and Janveja.

Phillips broke the tie, sending the ball from 40 yards with a gusting wind at his back. Mukhtar bounced a shot on the ground; it scraped the post and went in. Street connected for 20 yards, and Janveja scored on a breakaway.
