CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. C-9-96

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 24, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter mentioned:

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains: Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 24, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows: to show RC-1, Multiple-Family Residential District classification where OS-1, Office Service District classification is now shown in the area described as follows: Sidwell #23-01-351-003

A part of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 1, T1N, R9E, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, commonly known as 29800 Middlebelt Road.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 18th day of July, 1996, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.

ahead of two former Farmington prep stars. Tom Stamboulion (North Farmington) was third in the open division at 29:39.8 and Ben Goba (Farmington High) fourth at 29:53.8.

Stamboulion runs for the University of Michigan and Goba for the University of Tennessee.

"If they're training properly, they shouldn't be training hard now," Stark said. "They should-

n't be doing a four-mile race at peak level.

"Kerry and I are out of school and have an advantage. The summer is our running season. They want to be at their peak in the fall and spring for cross country and track."

Stark, who was accustomed to running in the Pennsylvania mountains where he grew up, had good things to say about the Farmington course.

"It had a little topology to it," he said. "I run a lot of races where the courses are flat; you

get complacent with it and don't get to work any new muscles.

"I was pleased with the course. The turns didn't hamper the course and, from what I could see when I was able to look around, the scenery was pretty nice."

Bagley, who ran for Livonia Stevenson in high school and Eastern Michigan in college, is the women's assistant track and cross country coach at the University of Detroit and a member of the Running Fit Team. Her running resume includes

appearances in the Boston and Alaska marathons.

"It was nice they had the open road and all the people out there helping you," she said of the Founders race. "It was well conducted. I liked the finish, how the people were lined up on the side of the street. That was neat."

If a clutch does not engage firmly upon release, it is possible that the disc has worn out. This component contains friction material that works much in the way that a brake lining does. When the disc's friction material wears out, the clutch slips. Before a clutch replacement is decided upon however, it should be determined if a clutch adjustment is all that is necessary. On some cars, an incorrect adjustment may mimic a burned-out disc and a simple adjustment can return the clutch to normal working order. If an adjustment is necessary, depress the clutch pedal. The first inch or two of pedal travel, referred to as "free play," should come easily. After that, there should be some sudden resistance felt as the force applied to the pedal. Most clutch designs require free play, without which the clutch can slip. Riding a clutch is one sure way to wear out this part quickly, often resulting in a costly repair that careful driving could have avoided.
