### October is infant loss awareness month

Huron Valley Hospital care-givers will join parents and professionals nationwide to observe October as Pregnand; and Infant Loss Awareness

At 1 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 12, the Commerce hospital's R.U.G.S. (Help, Understanding and Grief) support group will host a free "Walk To Remember" in the hospital's Conference Center.

The theme is "Seasons, and the service offers an occasion to remember babies who have died due to miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy, S.I.D.S., stillbirth or newborn death.

Families, friends, children and interested professionals are invited to attend.

"This is our tenth annual "Walk to Remember", said Sue Duff, R.N., coordinator of Huron Valley Hospital's Perinatal Loss Team.
"It is a gathering which symbolically joins people across the nation who are working to raise awareness of perinatal grief and ensure that sensitive

care is given to parents who experience a pregnancy or newborn loss," explained Duff. "Families need an opportuni-ty to acknowledge that their babies were real, are loved, grieved and remembered," she added

Since 1986 when the Mater-nal/Child Department at Huron Valley created the Perinatal Loss Tenm, services to families have grown to include the Mothers' Network and H.U.G.S. support group.
The Mothers' Network is an organization of volunteer moms who have experienced a loss and provide one-to-one support. H.U.G.S. (Help, Understanding and Grief Support) is a self-help group which meets the third Thursday of every month at the hospital from 7-9 p.m.
Led by a certified grief counselor, it also provides much-needed support during subsequent pregnancies.


