"These kids slam out of the high school at a very high speed, especially at lunch," said Good, whose evergreen tree in the front yard was completely uprooted. They are creating dangers on the road for everybody.

Student drivers need to slow down before someone gets scriously injured, Good said. The warning comes during a time with increasingly inclement weather.

"I hear the screeching out there; I just hope everything is OK." Good said.
