

## POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

## FIRES

## In Farmington Hills:

Firefighters from Station 4 found a small trash fire smoldering in a basement of a house on Coronet at 3:01 p.m. Nov. 25. Firefighters put out the fire with water. The resident had been staining a book case one day earlier and had discarded rags into the garbage with saw dust and small pieces of wood that apparently ignited. Damage to the house was \$15,000. Damage to the contents was \$50.

Firefighters from Station 1 put out an engine fire in a 1987 GMC step van on the shoulder of eastbound I-696 at 2:54 p.m. Nov. 26. The van had lost power and the driver pulled the van over on the shoulder. He tried to start it several times before noticing smoke coming from the dash and engine area. The fire caused \$2,000 in damage to the van and \$1,000 in damage to the contents.

Firefighters from Station 1 put out a fire inside a wall above a fireplace at a house on Eight Mile at 12:22 a.m. Nov. 26. The fire place and some electrical wiring were faulty. There was \$15,000 in damage to the house and \$1,000 in damage to the contents.

## BREAK-INS

## In Farmington Hills:
