Yesterday may have been a national holiday. But in most respects Dec. 26 was expected to be a normal day for inmates enrolled in the Oakland Sher-iffs Boot Camp.

of Class 1996-8. "It's helped a number of people turn their lives around."
Eader, who has been a drill instructor or commander since the program was started, said there would be no holiday lapse in discipline and no major changes in the routine.
Immates wouldn't pull work details in nearby communities like they usually do, he said. But they will be required to clean the bathrooms and police their living area. They're rough-

ly mid way through the eight-week program, and by now each inmate knows the routine and

what is expected.
No visitors, the licutenant

No visitors, the licutenant said.
But inmates may be allowed to make one phone call providing the duty officer thinks the calls are warranted. "That's a rare privilege," Eader said.
Class 1986-9 is the 61st in the program that enables judges to give nonviolent offenders a choice: A regular sentence, as much as a year in jail, or eight intense weeks of military training.

intense weeks of military transing.
So far, said Eader, 888 inmates have completed the eight-week program, and 381 have washed out.
The recidivism rate, or percentage of boot camp graduates who get in trouble with the law again, is about 11 percent, he said.
