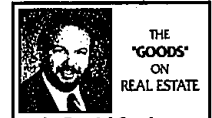

Notice of Adoption of Ordinance C-1-97, an Ordinance to amend Chapter 27, Subdivision of Land, Articles I, II and III, of the City Code of Farmington Hills to provide for the development of site condominiums in the City of Farmington Hills.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

 - Sec. 27-38. Preliminary plan - Preparation; submission; tentative approval.
 - Sec. 27-39. Preliminary plan - Preparation; submission; final approval.
 - Sec. 27-40. Final Plan.
 - Sec. 27-41. Recording prohibited prior to approval.
- Section 3.
Article III, Design Layout Standards, of Chapter 27, Subdivision of Land, Sections 27-57 and 27-59 through 27-62, only, is hereby amended:
- Sec. 27-57. Streets.
 - Sec. 27-59. Lots.
 - Sec. 27-60. Subdivision Open Space Plan.
 - Sec. 27-61. Natural Features.
 - Sec. 27-61. Floodplain.
- Section 4. Repealer.
Section 5. Severability.
Section 6. Savings.
Section 7. Effective Date.
Section 8. Enactment.
