

The woman, 36, is scheduled to appear in 47th District Court Jan. 20. A copy of the report will be forwarded to the Department of Social Services.

Accident leaves Farmington man hospitalized

A Farmington man remained hospitalized earlier this week after a Friday accident on snow-covered Eight Mile Road in Livo-nia.

The 26-year-old was in intensive care, in fair condition, at the University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor.

He was driving a 1991 Ford Escort west on Eight Mile, west of Newburgh, Friday mornial when he lost control and the car-spun into the path of an east-bound 1998 Ford van, said Sgt. Kevin Dawley of the Livonia Police Department's traffic bureau.

The van hit the Escort on the passenger side. The van's driver, a 38-year-old Walled Lake man, had no visible injuries. There were no passengers in either vehicle.

The Escort's driver was not belted in, Dawley said. He was taken by ambulance to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia, then airlift-ed to Ann Arbor.
