The fears were realized early Sunday morning when Scott Forwn, 19, 06 Farmington Hills, fell six stories to his death from the roof of the abandoned Fair-weather building at the corner of Five and Sheldon shortly before ta a.m. Chesed for years, the state-owned building is a fre-quent target for vandals and trespassers. All of them have long been the target of criticism from township police and elected officials, who voicod concerns that someone might eventually be hurt or killed in one of them.

"Our ultimate fear has been realized," supervisor Karen Woodside said this week of Sunday's tragedy. Police say the buildings are a magnet for everything from teen drinking to vandalism and drug

drinking to vandelism and drug cealing. In the last 20 years, there have been 267 documented township police runs to the 18-exer state property alone, 20 per-cent of which took place in 1996. The place is a real problem area. Northville Township is constantly kicking kids out of there but short of posting securi-ty guards, nothing's going to stop it, Gray said.
