

## POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

## FIRE

**In Farmington Hills:** Firefighters from Station 1 responded to a fire at the Green Hills Apartments at 4:48 p.m. Feb. 6. The fire had been put out with an extinguisher. The occupant had been smoking in the bedroom and noticed the smoke later as he was cooking. The fire caused \$7,500 in property damage and \$1,000 in damage to contents.

Firefighters from Station 1 responded to a fire in a 1988 GMC van on Colfax at 6:16 p.m. Feb. 6. The van owner's neighbor discovered the fire and the owner put it out with a dry chemical extinguisher and garden hose. The cause of the fire is unknown. Damage was \$5,000.

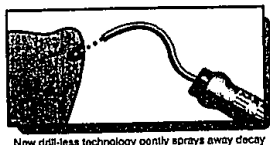
