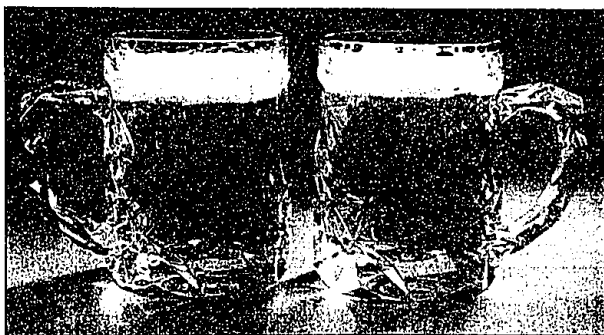


Crystal beer mugs
