

## POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

**In Farmington Hills:** Firefighters went on 101 runs for the week of March 17-23 including 68 medical emergencies that included 11 motor vehicle accidents. There was one fire.

## THEFT

**In Farmington Hills:** A \$300 cellular phone was stolen from a car parked on West 12 Mile March 20-21.
