PETITIONS may be requested from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, and must be filed between AUGUST 8 AND AUGUST 15, 1997, BY 5:00 P.M. All candidates who qualify will be placed on the ballot. There is no Primary Election. Voters will elect THREE Council persons on a Non-Partisan ballot at the Regular City Election on Tuesday, November 4, 1997.

Candidates for nomination must have the following qualifications:

- Must be a qualified, registered elector of the City of Farmington on August 15, 1997 and throughout the tenure of office.
- May not be in default to the City or any other governmental unit of the State.
- Must submit petitions signed by at least 50 and not more than 75 qualified registered electors by 5:00 p.m. on August 15, 1997.
- Must submit an affidavit of identity in duplicate and provide proof of citizenship.
- Must submit an affidavit as the name change (if applicable).

The terms of Council members Mary L. Bush, Arnold T. Campbell, and James K. Mitchell will expire in 1997.
