oldest and most successful summer arts program. Interlochen Arts Camp was named one of the top 10 summer camps in the country by Family Life magazine in 1996.

The camp offers intensive training in dance, theatre arts, music, visual arts and creative writing. The campers, ages 8 to 18, attend the programs for four or eight weeks. The camp attracts its 2,000 students from all 50 states and 38 other countries.

Throughout the course of the summer, over 600 events are presented at the camp by students, faculty, staff and guest artists such as James Taylor, Tony Bennett, and the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

Interlochen Center for the Arts is the non-profit umbrella organization for the camp, Interlochen Arts Academy and Interlochen Public Radio. The campus is located in northwest lower Michigan, near Traverse City.
