## Green Team holds on to win all-star game

Good time had by all.  
That was the theme Saturday night at Plymouth Canton's Centennial Educational Park as the short-handed Green Team bested the Royal Team, 3-2, in an entertaining Michigan High School All-Star Boys Soccer Game.  
However, Green Team coach Louis Stankovich (Harper Woods Notre Dame) had to be wondering how much fun it was going to be with only 13 available players, two of whom were goalkeepers.  
But the Green made the Royal squad envious, racing out to a 3-0 half-time advantage.  
Duke-bound Ali Curtis (Ann Arbor Pioneer) showed off some major league skills when he ripped down the left side and rifled a shot past Royal team keeper Rob Ewashka (Grosse Pointe South) with 30:56 left in the half.

(Oxford) made it 2-0 with 17:34 and Jason Hoffmeyer (Utica Ford) capped the first-half scoring with 2:07 remaining on an assist from Jeff Roche (Grand Blanc).  
"The first half we tried to knock the ball around and try to play quicker offensively," said Stankovich, the former University of Detroit men's head coach. "We wanted to knock the ball to the middle and pass it to the wing, or we were dead. We had a couple of nice goals and a couple of other good chances."  
"But in the second half we were going to see what happens. With only one sub we had to lean back. If we continued to push up, that meant we'd have to get all the way back, and I don't think we had enough bodies to do that."  
The Royal Team, coached by Detroit Rocker and former Yale University standout Lara

Richters, along with ex-Farmington High coach Ed Bortman, got their squad untracked during the second half, but it was too little, too late.  
Butler-bound Michael Trivelloni (Mount Clemens) had both goals, coming with 23:59 and 7:02 left. Redford Catholic Central's Miko Martin assisted on the second goal.  
The Royal Team, who began to get late in the game, pressed offensively during the final six minutes, but couldn't score the equalizer.  
Martin had five club teammates from the under-18 state cup champion Michigan Wolves with him on the field including goalkeeper Justin Jeffers (Lake Orion), Michigan State-bound Scott Babinski (Livonia Stevenson), Eastern Michigan-bound Jason Bennett (Canton) and Pete Pasoski (Livonia Churchill).  
"I knew just about everybody out there," said Martin, who is bound for Miami of Ohio. There were four from Vardar (another

club team). We know alot about each other and that made it easier.  
"I thought our goalie (Ewashka) played well and was very impressive. He made two big saves."  
Stevenson's Eric O'Neill (Green), who will play next fall for Schoolcraft College, and Jeffers (Royal) each shut out the opposition during their stints in goal.  
"All in all, it was a good show. "It was good, clean soccer and I think they had it when I played," said Richters, who was an assistant coach for the state Class A champion boys team (this time mayor) last fall. "I know a lot of these kids because I help in the boys under-18 Michigan Hawks and the Olympic Development program. I saw quite a few Wolves out there, which is fun to see."  
"One of the things you get out of an event like this is that you're not familiar with some of the kids from the west side of the state. And you can see they belong. There was no drop in play from one person to the other."  
Other area players for the victorious Green Team included Plymouth Salem's Christopher Curry, who is headed to Western Michigan, and Canton's Kevin Gniwiew, who is bound for Madonna.  
The Royal Team also featured Stevenson's Jason Roy (Madonna), Canton's Matt Ammons (Michigan) and Salem's Ryan Konley (Schoolcraft).

At least three other chances by the Reds involved Beitol. Her header off a corner kick by Shannon Beal (Troy Athens) went just over the net midway through the second half, and with 6:18 remaining she set up Jonny Farvianen (Plymouth Canton) from 18 yards out, but Farvianen shot wide.  
With 1:22 to go, Beitol's shot required a diving save from Cauzillo to prevent a goal.
