Beth Danielowicz picked up the victory on the mound. She allowed just one earned run, gave up three hits and struck out seven Fenton batters.

Shortstop Samantha McComb, playing over an injury, anchored a stellar defensive effort by NFWB, which committed just three errors in the entire tournament.

The Cobras opened tournament play with a lopsided 16-0 victory over Okemos.

Adam Fozzie (Orchard Lake St. Mary's) was 1-for-3 with an RBI. Ken Sorenson (Wyandotte Roosevelt) was 1-for-1, scored a run and had a timely sacrifice bunt that set the stage for Tony

Garza's (Southgate Aquinas) RBI single.

Sorenson's hit went for a single despite traveling all the way to the outfield fence.

"He hit a screamer off the fence for a single," said Beatty, chuckling. "He thought it was gone, admiring his shot."

The win improves the Braves to 14-1 overall, 12-1 in the league.

On Saturday, the Braves beat the Michigan Lake Area Rams, 10-7, behind the pitching of Dean Beatty and Miguel Lokuta. Cole was 3-5 with four runs scored and Mike Macek (Redford Union) was 4-5.

Call them the Cincinnati Kids. Livonia Travel, a Mickey Mantle-age (15-16 year-old) baseball team, improved its overall record to 23-5 by defeating the Cincinnati A's, 4-2, in eight innings in

the championship games June 29 of the Cincinnati Invitational at the University of Cincinnati.

Livonia broke a 2-2 tie in the eighth on back-to-back doubles by Casey Rogowski (Redford Catholic Central) and Mike Fisher (Farmington Hills Harrison) and a sacrifice fly by Derek Fox (Farmington Hills).

Fox pitched a complete game to earn the victory.

Top tournament hitters for Livonia included Rogowski, who was 3-for-15; Westland John Glenn's Dale Hayes, 7-for-16; and Fisher, 7-for-18.

In the tournament opener Friday, Hayes threw a complete-game five-hitter, and Ryan Wilmering (Redford CC) belted a three-run homer to beat JTM of Cincinnati, 4-3.

In the second game, Livonia Travel outslugged the Ontario Tigers, 17-14, as Roy Rabe (Livonia Stevenson) was the winning pitcher in relief.

Fisher went the distance in an 11-1 five-inning mercy rule victory over the St. Louis Redbirds.

In the semifinals, Rabe struck out six, did not allow a walk and scattered just four hits in a 4-1 victory over the Central Ohio champion Columbus Warhaws.

Fisher, Rogowski, Bob Malek (Redford CC), Mario D'Herin and Rabe are all hitting over .400 for the year.

Brett Wells (Livonia Churchill), John Ritzler (Stevenson) and Matt Niemiec (Redford CC) have also figured prominently in the team's early season success.

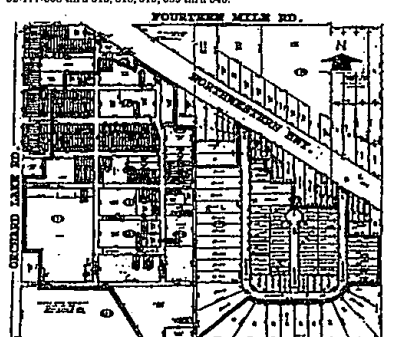
