Judy said she began feeling contractions about 12 minutes apart around midnight. They went to five minutes, three and then to 'Oh my God,' she said.

Husband Jim romained calm during the ordeal even managing to get Jack back to sleep after he awake. He called 9:1-1 and talked to the operator, who instructed him to clear the baby's air passages and tie the umbilical cord. He used a shoestring.

Farmington Hills Assistant to the Fire Chief Bob Rebtoy arrived four minutes after the call was made.

"I got there and knocked on the door and nobody answered. I could hear someone huffing it down the stairs," Rebtoy said. "She was sitting on the floor and the baby was the legs.

"The baby was beautiful. There was no discoloration and it was breathing, It was a great delivery."

Rebtoy and fireflighters presented the Madigans with a special teddy bear and a framed copy of the incident report to commemorate the special birth. In his 29 years on the job, Rebtoy has helped deliver (be babies. "All five of them have turned out great," he said.

At 8 pounds and 21 inches, Kelly Ann is the largest baby delivered in the Madigan family. Mom said the infant sleeps regularly.


