JEWISH HISTORY
Judy Levin Cantor of Bloomfield Hills, archivist of Cong. Shaarey Zedek of Southfield, spoke on a panel at the annual conference of the Michigan Archival Association on the Cranbrook campus in Bloomfield Hills. Cantor utilized the archives from the collection of the 135-year-old congregation to present a brief overview of the history of the Jews of Michigan, which dates back to 1761 when Ezekiel Solomon first came as a fur trader to Fort Michilimackinac. Cantor is immediate past president of the Jewish Historical Society of Michigan and editor of the journal, "Michigan Jewish History."
