#### Leftover deer permits

Leftover deer permits

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources announced that more than 160,000 leftover anterless deer hunting licenses will be available for sale over the counter later this month. There are 68,971 general licenses available and 91,533 private land licenses go on sale at 10 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 25 at license dealers statewide while the private land licenses go on sale at 10 a.m. Monday, Sept. 29.

General permits may be used on public or private land while private land permit may be used on the specific parcel of land applied for. To receive a private land permit the individual must provide the tax number of the land to be hunted (40 acres or more in Zones I and II and larces or more in Zones I and II and landsware.
