

Hearn, Gabriel spark Raiders past Vikings

Following a scoreless first half Friday, North Farmington broke open a close game to defeat host Walled Lake Central in boys soccer, 6-1.

Craig Hearn scored three goals and Dan Gabriel two for the Raiders, 7-3-1 overall and 4-3-1 in the Western Lakes Activities Association.

With the game scoreless at halftime, North coach Ron Meteyer said he "cautioned (his players) to keep playing good soccer, and it paid off."

Hearn scored the first two goals, the second being a penalty kick. Viktor Juncak lifted a free kick to Gabriel, who made it 3-0.

Dan Mooney took a pass from Toney Cincinlano and crossed to Gabriel for the fourth goal.

After Pete Kelso scored for the Vikings (1-9-2), Joe Shargorodsky worked a give-and-go with Hearn for the last North marker.

Tony Munaco played the entire game in goal and made six saves for the Raiders, who had 17 shots.

On Wednesday, the Raiders tied host Livonia Franklin 1-1 in a WLAAC crossover match.

Adam Shanko scored on a direct free kick with 12 minutes left in the game to give Franklin (4-7-1) the tie.

Amit Klatchko's penalty kick goal 12 minutes into the second half resulted in the North goal.

"I thought Ryan Kracht did a good job marking Craig Hearn," Franklin coach Dave Hebestreit said. "Hearn is a great player, very dangerous. He had some

opportunities but didn't score."

It was a frustrating game for the Raiders, who had plenty of chances but little to show for it, according to Meteyer.

North hit the post three times, and Hearn beat a defender four times only to shoot wide of the net.

REDFORD CC 2, DeLaSALLE 1: Redford Catholic Central's winless streak in boys soccer against Warren DeLaSalle ended Thursday as the Shamrocks upset the three-time Class A state champion Pilots at Garden City Junior High School.

The Shamrocks took a 2-0 halftime lead and the only goal DeLaSalle scored came in the second half when one of the Shamrocks accidentally kicked a ball past goalkeeper Matt Kessler.

The win improved the Shamrocks to 4-2 in the Catholic League Central Division, 7-3 overall. The win came days after the Shamrocks upset U-D Jesuit, another state ranked team.

"This was a huge win for us, we finally got the monkey off our back against them," CC coach Dana Orsucci said. "After the (brother) Rice game, we started pulling it together; the seniors were showing more leadership."

Andrew Kogut scored the game's first goal, heading in a long throw-in from Dave Schiele. CC took a 2-0 lead with a minute remaining in the half when Gavin Walsh scored on a scramble in front after a corner kick by Shawn Kahane.

places in the IM with respective times of 2:38.73 and 2:43.66. Meredith Crawford and Melissa D'Arcy did the same in the breaststroke, finishing second (1:18.75) and third (1:20.89), respectively.

Cavicholi's breaststroke time was a personal best as was Heather Bruce's second-place effort of 1:09.52 in the backstroke.

"Karen Mathie had a real good meet, especially in the backstroke, and Heather Bruce stepped up and did very well in the breaststroke, too," Farmington coach Lisa Collins said.

The Falcons (1-2) were only ahead by four points after the 200 freestyle relay but increased the margin to 21 following the breaststroke.

Raiders remain unbeaten

North Farmington whipped host Plymouth Salem, 103-83, and ran its record to 4-0 in dual meets Thursday.

The trio of Hannah Pawlewicz, Nevra Alver and Cheri Farber paced the Raiders once again,

winning two events each and contributing to a pair of relay victories as well.

Tara Grider saw the opening leg of the medley and 400 freestyle relays.

She was followed by the aforementioned trio in the latter as North posted a 3:56.32 time. Alver, Kristen Burke and Farber completed a 1:58.43 swim in the medley.

Burke and Pawlewicz were teamed with Jennifer Beaudick and Lauren Turner in the 200 freestyle relay, and it proved to be a winning combination as the Raiders took first place in 1:45.79.

Pawlewicz won the 200 freestyle (2:00.90) and the butterfly (1:02.11). Alver touched first in the individual medley (2:21.79) and breaststroke (1:12.37). Farber achieved her victories in the backstroke (1:04.12) and 50 freestyle (25.88).

North's Annie Jacobs won the 500 freestyle (5:37.31). Salem's Michelle Wallon was first in diving with 198.95 points, and Car-

rie Dzialo won the 100 free (57.74). The Rocks are 1-1.

Marlins rout Mustangs

Farmington Hills Mercy is far ahead of its closest competitor in Catholic League girls swimming and diving based on dual-meet results Thursday.

The host Marlins had no trouble dispatching rival Birmingham Marian, a perennial runner-up to Mercy in the league meet, 135-55. The Marlins are 3-0 in duals.

Elizabeth Posvar made a state cut in the 50-yard freestyle with a first-place time of 25.07, and she also won the breaststroke with a 1:11.62 finish.

Posvar anchored the winning 200 freestyle relay team (1:44.43) and helped the Marlins win the medley relay (1:54.93).

Amy McCullough and Posvar teamed with Erin Downs and Kelly Carlin in the medley and with Danielle Clayton and Elizabeth MacDonald in the 200 free.

MacDonald was a double individual winner in the 200

freestyle (1:58.77) and the butterfly (1:03.38).

MacDonald helped Mercy win the 400 freestyle relay, combining with Carlin, Betsy Lambert and Jenny MacDonald for a 3:49.39 time.

Carlin also won two races — the individual medley (2:18.18) and the 100 freestyle (66.57).

Lambert captured first place in the 500 freestyle (5:29.75), and McCullough touched first in the backstroke (1:03.6).

Mercy's Becca Gould won the diving competition with 204.75 points. James Pullum was second with a total of 190.68.

The Marlins had other seconds from McCullough, 50 free (25.45); Clayton, 100 free (58.45); Jenny MacDonald, 500 free (6:39.75); and Katie Callan, backstroke (1:06.9).

Marian's Lauren Najarian was second in the 200 free (2:02.61) and butterfly (1:03.63); Brady Kosnick was second in the IM (2:23.92) and Erin Scussel was second in the breaststroke (1:16.17).


