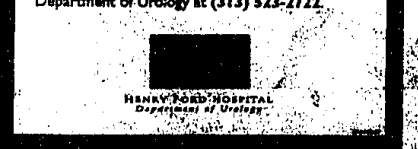

Slow start, but after that everything clicked for Plymouth Canton Thursday against visiting Livonia Franklin.

The Chiefs rebounded from a 12-12 first-quarter stalemate to pull away from the Patriots, outscoring them 35-6 in the next two periods to post a 58-27 triumph in a Western Lakes Activities Association girls basketball game.
