## BIRMINGHAM

**Intravenous poisoning death:** The body of a 66-year-old Kentucky woman was found at the Quality Inn in Bloomfield Township on Oct. 8. A letter found in the room stated that she was a patient of assisted suicide crusader Jack Kevorkian of West Bloomfield. Calls to Geoffrey Fieger, Kevorkian's Southfield-based attorney, were not returned. The latest death marks the third in two months at the hotel.

## Michigan Directory Company honored

The study will be presented to the Michigan Department of Transportation in February in hope of obtaining federal funds to alleviate congestion and improve safety on the road.

## ROCHESTER

**Stalking complaint:** A Rochester Hills Meijer store employee has filed a stalking complaint against a 27-year-old Royal Oak man. According to the

employee, the man started stalking her a year ago, by frequently coming through her check-out line and staring at her. Oakland County Sheriff's Department investigators contacted the man about the complaint Oct. 7. He denied the allegations.

## SOUTHFIELD

**Tel-12 traffic considered:** The intersection of Telegraph and 12 Mile Road topped the Oakland County Traffic Improvement Association's list of frequent crashes sites. Although the Tel-12 intersection hasn't had a

fatality in three years, city officials responded by again proposing a new ramp near or at Franklin road. Both the Michigan Highway Department and Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments have endorsed the suggestion, but funding is a problem, said city administrator Robert Block.

**Peace Garden:** The Troy Peace Garden came a step closer to reality Oct. 4 at a groundbreaking ceremony at its future site in the civic center. The garden will

## WEST BLOOMFIELD




