in Australia. With this system, camera-like devices are meanted on poles at various intersections. The devices do not produce picture images and can't see into presence of cars and monitor the flow of traffic.

The devices relay information to the road commission which automatically adjusts traffic light timing to allow the smoothest flow of traffic. Timing to for traffic lights can vary up to 15 seconds.

Along with easing traffic, AST-TRAC has hidden advantages, like reducing air pollution. With more cars moving there are less spewing out fumes idling at intersections.
According to the road commission. FAST-TRAC also has helped stem the number of traffic accidents at intersections where monitors have been installed. Monitors have been installed at 300 intersections across the county so far. More monitors may be installed along Haggerty with the border of Commerce Township.
