points) and Adam Weber (nine points) to graduation, and Mikel decided not to make senior David Viane part of the team this year.

Gargol, who averaged just over four points, can shoot the three or he did in a game against Walled Lake Central when it seemed he couldn't miss and can help with rebounding (2.2).

"We're trying to get some shooters on the wing to take some of the pressure off Justin and Trevor on the inside," Mikel said. "We have to have some kind of perimeter game, so teams don't just collapse on us."

"We think our seniors will be able to step up and contribute from the perimeter. Those three guys have the most experience, and I think all three will be able to do that for us."

Mikel said he has talked to his players about not becoming a one-man show on offense.

"Teams that know about Trevor will try to do something to take him out of the game," he said. "We can't expect Trevor to carry the whole team on his back all season."

Other perimeter players are 6-foot juniors Evan Roehm and Charles Avery, who played in the last four varsity games, 5-10 senior Tony Gordon and 5-11 sophomore Todd Anthony.

"I'm planning on playing a lot of people early in the season, and we'll see how things go," Mikel said.

Rotating at point guard will be 5-7 junior Randy Hassan, 5-8 sophomore Mark Green and 5-10 freshman Denny Mikel, the coach's son who has an extensive AAJ background and has played in three straight national tournaments.

"(Hassan) does a nice job of getting the ball to the right people, and those are people we can

always use," Mikel said, adding Green was on the varsity for the last six games.

"(Mikel) worked hard and played with the varsity all summer. He did a nice job and earned a spot on the varsity. He's excited and looking forward to it; it will be kind of a neat experience."

The performance by the guards and wings will be the key to the season.

"If we get good play from the two guard or wing people, we could have a very successful season, because I'm confident our inside people will play well this year," he said.

"Those three positions will play a key role in the kind of season we have. If they play well, I think Trevor, Justin and our inside people will be more successful."

"Tony is a junior now, and the sophomore mistakes should be gone," Beyar said. "He should be able to polish up his wrestling. Dean has been there a long time and should have a good year."

Guth (9-13) and Lukas (5-8) will battle each other for the starting position at 171. Wood is slated to wrestle at 189 but will be challenged by sophomore Carl Primrose.

The Falcons, who were 7-12 in duals meets and finished eighth in the league, will have freshmen wrestling at 103, 112 and

152. Sophomore Robin Firman, the team's only girl, will be the starter at 125. She was on the team last year but didn't wrestle in any varsity matches.
