McCarthy and Rubin tied for second place on floor with 9.1 scores. Farmington's Kelly Barenie was fourth (8.9) and Stoler fifth (8.85).

In the all-around, Rubin was third (33.35), Barenie fourth (32.3), Walled Lake's Stephanie Roy fifth (32.1) and Ouellette sixth (31.95).

Farmington started its WIAA schedule Jan. 7 by defeating Plymouth Salem at the Farmington Training Center, 132.60 to 114.31.

The individual event winners were Rubin on beam (8.25) and floor (9.0), Bracht on vault (8.55) and Ouellette on bars (8.4).

Farmington swept the top five places on beam with Millett scoring 7.05, Stoler 7.9, Ouellette 7.7 and Barenie 7.4.

The top five on vault included Stoler (8.5), Clark (8.45), Millett (8.3) and Ouellette (8.3); bars: Rubin (8.35), Bracht (8.15), Clark (8.0) and Schmieding (7.55); floor: Barenie (8.95), Bracht (8.85), Stoler (8.55) and Ouellette (8.55).

"Brook Rubin, Kelly Barenie and Marie Law were the core of the team last year," Dwyer said. "There's a lot of pressure on them, because we need those top three scores and they're doing a

great job.

"Liz Stoler has turned it up a notch from last year. That was her highest all-around by far and it's going to keep happening. She's definitely going to be one of our highest scorers on floor, vault and beam."

"I knew (Ouellette) had some potential and has been a pleasant surprise. Her beam and vault have room for improvement, which she's capable of doing. She's good but she can be better. She has given us the depth we really needed."

In the Plymouth Invitational, Farmington was fifth (133.5) among 15 teams with Troy Athens (140.7), Rochester Adams (140.4), Freeland (139.15) and Brighton (139) finishing ahead of it.
