Social Security benefits

For single individuals with provisional incomes of less that \$25,000 and married couples fling a joint return with annual incomes of less that \$32,000, no amount of Social security income is taxable. For single individuals, provisional income between \$25,000 and married couples filing jointly with provi-

sional incomes between \$32,000 and \$44,000, no more that 50 percent of Social Security income is included in gross income. For single individuals with provisional incomes in excess of \$34,000 and married couples filing jointly with provisional incomes in excess of \$44,000, no more than \$5 percent of Social Security is allowed to be included in gross income. A viable tax planning strategy for individuals with taxable Social security benefits is to reduce provisional income to the \$25,000 (or \$32,000 for married couples) level so that all Social Security benefits are nontaxable. This can sometimes be accomplished by a thorough review of currently existing investments and, if appropriate, shifting part of the investments into assets that generate nonreportable of the investments into assets that generate nonreportable income. An example of such an asset is a single promium deferred annuity. The income from this annuity is tax-deferred and therefore is not reportable as current income for purposes of Social Security tax calculation. Furthermore, when annuity perments are received, a portion of each payment is treated as a return of original principal and incit taxed. The remainder of the payment represents the prior deferred income and is fully taxed.
