Although a change in reporting procedures at the state level added around 1,000 additional crimes to those the department already deals with, he said, there still was an 8.4 percent reduction overall in the 20 most serious, or Group A, crimes.

The classification, which includes nurder, forcible sex offenses, robbery and narcetics violations, declined overall from 6,616 incidents/offenses in 1996 to 5,142 last year, the report said.

to 5,142 last year, the report said.

Although forcible sex offenses increased 20.6 percent. Dwyer noted such offenses were almost exclusively committed by persons known to the victims and are outside the centrel of the police department.\*

Overall, the annual report showed a 2.1 percent increase in crime, which Dwyer said expected due to yearly popularition increases, additional trafficerashes, more sick and injured complaints and additional police officer activities.

The increase showed a 2.1 percent jump in Group B incidents/offenses, which include operating a vehicle under the

influence of alcohol and liquor-law violations, and a 2.5 percent rise in Group C, which includes traffic crashes and oflonesse and juvenile complaints.

Liquor violations jumped 76.6 percent and local ordinance vio-nations 28.1 percent in Group B, but the chief said those increases are reflective of aggressive policing and more officers discov-ering offenses while on patrol.

Dwyor said the department benefited from upgrades in technology such as live-scan finger-printing, which is an automated, inkless system that has enhanced the mug-shot imaging system.
