## Fletcher leads Hawks to 3rd-place finish

Senior Mahogany Fletcher won the 100-meter dash with a season best time of 12.5 seconds Saturday to lead Farmington Harrison to a third-place finish in the Algonquin Musketry Relays.

Fletcher also anchored Harrison's second-place 800 and 400 relay teams.

Temica Clayton, Lisa Rosemary, Claire Colby and Fletcher ran 1:50.3 in the 800 and 52.1 in the 400. Both are best times for this season.

The Hawks were second in the 1,600 relay, too, Marina DeMeyer, Becky Zak, Kim Washington and Clayton ran the race in 4:22.

Fletcher also helped Harrison garner a third place in the long jump as she, Colbert and Gabriel Newton had a combined jump of 42.6.

Colbert, Clayton, DeMeyer and Zak got the Hawks third place in the Bat Relay in which the first leg in 100 meters followed by 200, 300 and 600, Harrison's team finished in 3:21.7.

Kerstin Andrzejewski and Erica Berg teamed with Julie Kluka for fifth place the shot put and with Karen Knutson for sixth place in the discus.

Harrison had another sixth place in the three-person 1,600 event. Each member of the team runs 1,600 meters and the times are added for a team total. Lynn Andrzejewski, Amy Schaner and Erin Brozovich had an 18:47

time. Harrison was third in the Claret A division, finishing behind Port Huron and Rochester Adams.

Two of Harrison's top athletes, Emily Mayberry and Yoko Minowa, were unavailable and didn't compete Saturday.

"We had a slow start, but we made a strong comeback in the afternoon events, and we were pretty happy with that," Harrison coach Mark Babcock said. "Under the circumstances, (the team finish) was probably better than we had hoped."

## Raiders take 7th place

North Farmington's girls team was seventh in the Stafford Relays at Walled Lake Saturday. Novi won the 12-team meet.

The Raiders had their best finish in the shuttle hurdle relay with Brittany Vithel, Courtney Camp, Katie Gaffey and Katie Callahan putting together a time of 1:12.1.

The Marlins were one stroke shy of matching the school record 167 they recorded last week when they defeated Birmingham Marian at Rackham Golf Course, 168-204.

Erin Borowiec and Kristen Smith shot 46 each to complete the team score. The Marlins are 6-0 in the league and 8-1 overall. Jacqueline Camilli posted a 48, Nicole Welsh 50, Jenny Brock and Kristin Stroh 53 each for the Marlins, who are 3-3 in league matches.

"I thought the girls played very well today," Mercy coach Vicky Kowalski said. "They had a lot of nice approach shots. I saw them one-putt some greens but mostly two-putt the rest."

Three girls three-putted the first two greens, because they were really slow. Once she realized that, everything was a one- or two-putt the rest of the way."

Mercy shot the record 167 in a match with Livonia Ladywood (2004) April 30 at par-36 Glen Oaks Golf Course.

Jennifer Borowiec shot 38 that day, too, to pace the Marlins; Erin Borowiec, Harbar and Smith followed with three 43s.

On the first day of the Traverse City Invitational Friday the Marlins were second behind Grose Ile, 318-334.

With defending Class A champion Grandville taking part Saturday, the Marlins finished third. Grandville shot 318, Grose Ile 333 and Mercy 336.
