# County economic boon to taper

#### Economic forecast to be unveiled Friday

Oakland County's economic climate is likely to continue growing for the remainder of this year and into 1999, according to the University of Michigan Insti-tute of Labor and Industrial

Relations.

But for the first time in almost a decade, the forecast includes a "tapering off" in the number of job. opportunities, according to county Executive L. Brooks Patterson

county Executive L. Broom Fair-terson. "It's still a very positive report," Patterson said this week as he propared for the 13th annual Oakland County Eco-nomic Forecast Luncheon. "But some tapering off is expected," he said.

Pattorson said Wednesday he
has seen the forecast that will be
presented in detail Friday at the
Northfield Hilton in Troy by UM researchers including
cenomists George A Fulton and
Donald R. Grimes.

He declined to go into detail,
but Patterson acknowledged
what some businesses have discussed previously:
Oakland has plenty of jobs . . .
perhaps too many.
"It's a dilemma presented by
full employment." Patterson
and. "The good news is we have
a lot of jobs. But bad news is
there aren't enough qualified
people to fill them.

"That's not good, because when

yeu can't fill the jobs, they tend to go somewhere else." The annual luncheon is usually a standing-room-only affair, and this year's will be no exception, judging by early ticket sales. With a capacity of 700 people, early sales as of Tuesdor, exceeded 560. While networking is part of the fare, the big attraction is the U-M due's analysis and predictions - based on number of economic indicators including interest rates, exports, construction and job growth.

Over the last decade, the forecasts have had a high degree of accuracy. Over the last 12 years, the margin of error has been 1.4 percent, Fulton said Wednesday. Over the last five years, the crror ratio was closer to .6 percent, he said.
