Concealed teams are No. 1

BASEBALL
Not only did the Concealed Security baseball team (11-year old division) win the Northville Kiwanis Early Bird Tournament last week, but it accomplished the feat in thrilling fashion. Trailing 9-3, Concealed erupted for 11 unanswered runs to beat North Farmington-West Bloomfield 14-9 and win the championship. Concealed, now 11-1 overall, received 4th shutout innings from Philip Mabey (Livonia). Mabey entered the game in the second inning and didn't allow a hit or walk in his stint, while fanning four batters. At the plate, Mabey drove in three runs with a pair of hits. Brian Shay (Garden City) added two hits and two RBI, while Jeff Richard was 2-for-4 with one RBI. Mark Pirronello added a

key two-run single in the comeback. Concealed advanced to the championship with a 17-1 victory over Northville Richard, a 14-2 rout of NFWB and a 13-3 triumph over Northville Cicla. Members of the 11-year old team include Eric Driscollman (Garden City), Max Rodeghier (Farmington Hills), Andres Stafford, Alan Hagedorn (Westland), Chris Rusin (Canton), Scott Szpyryka, Casey Sargent and Brandon Giamor. Concealed Security's 12-year old team also won the tournament title in Northville with a 13-5 victory over the Novi Expos in the championship game. Concealed improved to 7-0 overall.

Michael Krause (Garden City) was the hero in the decisive game as he went 4-for-4 (two triples) and knocked in four runs. Jason Krug (Redford) added a pair of hits and drove in one run. Chuck Pate pitched four innings to record the win. He scattered three hits and struck out four. Anthony Volpe (Farmington Hills) collected the save. The 12-year olds had earlier beaten the Michigan Indians 13-3, NFWB 7-4, Wayne 30-1 and Northville 30-1. In the rout of Wayne, Carl Miller went 5-for-6. Other members of the team are Chris Rigley (Redford), Robert Frasier, Robert Reznick, Tim Kalezynski (Farmington), Mark McDanniel and Mike Monterey (Farmington Hills).

Groves gains regional victory

The Falcons are on a mission and took a big step toward achieving their goal Tuesday. Behind a two-goal effort by junior forward Becky Danilewicz, the Birmingham Groves girls soccer team earned a 2-0 shutout victory over Trenton in a Division II regional semifinal game at Ypsilanti Lincoln High School. The win boosts Groves (14-3-3) into the regional championship game Saturday against Saline, 1 p.m. at Lincoln. "Our expectations are for the following Saturday (state finals

on June 6)," said Groves coach Derek Williford. "I think we have the talent to get there. We just have to play to our ability." Junior midfielder Sabrina Borgquist added a goal and an assist for the winners, and junior goalie Emily Posner made three saves in net to post the shutout victory. "I don't think any (Groves) girls soccer team has been in a regional championship game," said Williford. "I was kind of

worried (Tuesday) about the bus ride. It took us an hour and a half to get there. We played a good first half, but we kind of took it down to their level in the second half. I think the long ride caught up with us." The Falcons advanced to the regional level by winning two games in last week's district tournament. Groves defeated Birmingham Marian and Farmington to claim the district. The Falcons have blanked their last two playoff foes, including Farmington in the district title game, 1-0 in double overtime.




