Being diagnosed with cancer at any age in life can turn a life upside down in a matter of moments. But for many cancer patients, the difference between feeling helpless or empowered lies in their ability to develop emotional coping skills.

These tenets are at the heart of the Mens and Womens Cancer Support groups sponsored by Botsford General Hospital's Health Development Network.

The new group, which convenes the third Thursday of each month, has a unique approach. Each group is facilitated by a social worker and oncology

nurse. Both male and female members convene in one group every third month for a joint educational program focusing on topics pertinent to both sexes, otherwise, male and female members meet separately. Family members and friends are encouraged to attend and enthusiastically welcomed.

On Thursday, June 18, Botsford oncology nurse Amy Bone, RN, discusses "Managing the Effects of Chemo and Radiation Therapies." The gatherings, which are free, meet from 7 to 9 p.m. at Botsford Hospital's 2 East Classrooms.
