In Le Jardin, Swarovski crystal captures familiar garden objects - the bouquet, flower basket, wheelbarrow and watering can. These designs have a two-dimensional quality - the wheelbarrow wheel actually spins. Gold accents highlight the wisteria, daisy and carnation pins.

Daniel Swarovski & Company was founded in 1895 in the Austrian village of Wattens.

Swarovski was a crystal stone cutter who invented an electric machine to precision cut the stones in large quantities. Today precision cutting remains a hillmark of Swarovski, the leading manufacturer of cut crystal for the jewelry, fashion, collectibles, lighting and gift industries.
