## Police seek information on gunman in robbery

Farmington Hills police have released a composite of a man believed to be involved in an armed robbery where an elderly couple was tied up at their home June 10.

He is described as an overweight balding man between 30 and 40 years old and approximately 5-foet-11. He has a mustache and was wearing a Red Wings shirt, jacket and blue jeans.

He was accompanied by a man wearing a mask during the armed robbery, which took place around 11:30 a.m. Wednesday in the East Copper Creck aubdivision near 13 Mile and flaisted.

A 71-year-old man was confronted by the man depicted in the police sketch with a brown automatic handgun in his garage on 28989 Spyglass. The homeowner and his 67-year-old wife, who went to the garage to see what the commotion was about, were ordered to the stairs where they were bound with cable ties and electrical tape.

The robbers told the man and woman they wouldn't be hurt as long as they found money.

After the pair left, the husband was able to break free and


