In a sense, long-term investors shauldn't worry, about short-term volatility. However, some forms of volatility represent a totally appropriate near-term telescoping of consensus judgments about long-term prospects.

More specifically, there are times when volatility can be more than just noise or dips, or a buying or selling opportunity.

Such short-term volatility
may indeed carry a consensus
message about improvements
or deterioration in the long-

message about improvements or deterioration in the long-term outlook.

In addition, sometimes volatility can itself be a problem—in cases where it triggers other unsettling market developments, for instance, and settling and send ripples of instability out into the real financial world.

To recapitulate, volatility is a measure of risk and cannot summarily be dismissed.

However, if it is short term and relatively harmless, no action need be taken. On the other hand, if the degree of volatility is incompatible with the investor's objective realities of cash flow, net worth, need for liquidity, and time horizon, then it should be taken seriously and necessary adjustments should be made.

In any event, since it is not easy to make informed judgments about the type of volatility their gobserved, extreme care should be exercised in making investment decisions.
