Bauman played in 17 games last year as a backup center, averaging 1.8 points and 1.2 rebounds per game as the Titans findsied 25-6 overall and earned their first NCAA Tournament borth since 1979.

Before suffering a mid-season ankle injury, the 222-pound center saw valuable action against Michigan and Michigan State.

But his playing time diminished during the final streth of the season.

Bauman said he needed a year off to decide if and where he would play again.
