'98 season of triumphs for 10-year-old Cobras

The NFWB Cobras 10-year-old travel team finished a successful baseball season with a 44-5-1 record.

The Cobras won the regular-season Little Conans Mickey Mantle Division title with a 18-2 mark.

Drew Kahlo led the way during league play with a .535 batting average, and Matt Friedman recorded a .460 average.

The season began with the Cobras going 3-1 in winning a tournament in Davison. They went on to qualify for the USSSA World Series in Louisiana by winning all five of their games in the qualifier at Canton.

Six members of the Cobras made the all-tournament team, with Danny Richard being named the tournament MVP.

The Cobras then traveled to Battle Creek for the Mayor's Invitational Tournament and posted a 7-0 record to become the first NFWB team ever to win the prestigious event.

Vinnie Sarafa paced the offense with a .421 average, and Brandon Borsen went 3-for-4 in the championship game.

During the tournament, Brad Lovick pitched a two-hitter while also leading the team in RBI. Outfielder Mike Tassoni and infielder Ray Szwak were defensive standouts.

The Cobras hosted the NFWB Fourth of July Tournament and finished second after going 4-1. Stovo Bayoff had a good tournament, compiling an on-base percentage over .600.

By finishing first in their league, the Cobras qualified for the AABC district tournament in Marshall and finished 4-0, becoming the No. 1 seed for regional play.

In the regional, the Cobras knocked out two teams from Illinois before losing and finishing third in the region with a 3-2 mark.

Jeff Petry batted a team-leading .524 and Josh Glowacki .375 in combined district and regional play.

Over the 50-game season, Richard was the team leader with a .487 batting average while also posting a 10-0 pitching record with a 1.51 earned run average.

Catcher Mike Wiseman batted .423 and threw out more than 50 baserunners. Sarafa finished 9-0 as a pitcher and batted .469, and Lovick collected a team-high 66 RBI.

The Cobras outscored their competition 577-193 overall.

Alan Borsen and Jim Tassoni were in charge of managing the Cobras and were assisted by coaches Nathlem K. Sarafa and Dan Petry.

Seniors Christina Grajewski, Nicole Gopoin, Carey Czech and Kristin Salla and juniors Ann Stacey, Marissa Macandog, Michelle Tarrian and Katie Janhevich were the doubles players Thursday against Regina.

Sophomores Amber Rivzi and Emily Bakken and freshmen Lauren Davidson and Kelly Tarrian also have played doubles and will provide the basis for future Mercy teams.
