Fury wins pair of tourney titles

The Farmington Fury '85 had a strong start in the fall season by winning the St. Clair Shores and Dearborn invitational.

The Fury went 4-0 at the St. Clair Shores tournament. In bracket play, the Fury defeated the Corunna Ontario Wildcats, Fraser and the St. Clair Shores Strikers by a combined score of 21-1. The Fury beat the Charlotte Scorpions to win the championship 6-0.

Peter Vlachos led the Fury attack with four goals. Brian Hejka, Paul Johnson and Nathan Perkovich recorded three goals apiece.

The Fury defense of Rob Camaj, Matt Cave, Matt Holland and goalkeepers Steve Denton and Jon Parker allowed only one goal in the four games.

In the Dearborn tournament, the Fury began play against the tough Dearborn Heights Jets.

Noah Stern scored the only goal of the first half (assist Vlachos). Play opened up in the second half and the Fury took advantage. After Parker scored on a free kick, Vlachos tallied off a pass from Johnson. Stern assisted on a goal from Holland, which gave the Fury a 3-0 victory.

The St. Clair Shores Bullets ended the Fury winning streak with a 3-0 shutout in a bracket crossover match.

The Fury rebounded in its third game and beat Michigan United, 3-0. Vlachos opened the scoring on a goal assisted by Johnson. Johnson later scored on a penalty kick.

Wesley Fan closed the scoring after converting a through ball from midfield off the foot of Greg Lechowicz. Fan drove around a

defender and faked out the goal-keeper before finding the net.

The Fury avenged its earlier loss to the Bullets in the final, 2-1, although the Bullets scored first after capitalizing on a poor Fury clearance.

The Fury tied the game at 1-1 before halftime when Stern scored from just inside the 6-yard line.

Vlachos scored the winning goal in the second half (assisted by Hejka). The Fury defense did the rest, shutting down the Bullets' long-ball attack.

The Fury has won three championships in its last four tournaments.

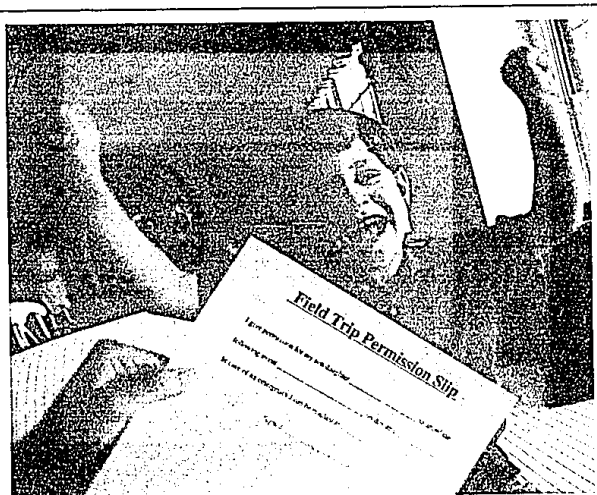
